## C. Eligibility

### Athlete Eligibility

Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter (at all times) may participate in the European Games. For the sake of clarity, all athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter in force during the qualification period for the European Games up until the end of the period of the European Games.

#### Age Requirements

All athletes participating in the Baku 2015 European Games must be born between 1975 – 1997 (18 – 40 y.o., based on the date of birth)

#### Medical and Anti-Doping Requirements

To be eligible to participate in the Baku 2015 European Games, all athletes must satisfy the medical requirements according to AIBA Medical and Anti-Doping Committee.

To be eligible to participate in the Baku 2015 European Games, all athletes must comply with anti-doping controls in accordance with the AIBA and WADA Doping Rules.

## D. Qualification Process

The qualification system allows for the participation of the best athletes through a fair and transparent process within the framework of the Olympic Charter.

## E. Confirmation process for Quota Places

The EUBC Competition Commission will publish the list of qualified athletes as per the AIBA/EUBC ranking lists as of 30 June 2014 (women) and quota places for men will be published by 22 September 2014. BEGOC on behalf of the EUBC will send the confirmation to the respective NOCs/NFs.

### Reallocation of unused quota places:

For women's event if a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next athlete according to the ranking list. For men's event in the case NOCs are not able to fill their assigned quota of boxers, then by 1 March 2015 EUBC will reallocate the vacant quota places to those NOCs that have requested a larger number of quota places.

Any unused Universality Places will be returned to the EUBC for them to reallocate.

## G. 2016 Olympic Qualification

For men three quota places per weight category at the Baku 2015 European Games will be awarded for the 2015 AIBA World Boxing Championships. The Top Ranked Boxer(s) in each weight category of the 2015 AIBA World Boxing Championships will each obtain a quota place for the Rio 2016 Olympic Games.
